FOSTERING PRIDE

Dene Heroes Publications hosted book launch celebrations in Déline, Fort Good Hope, and Colville Lake.

In addition to book distribution and readings, participants enjoyed feasting, speeches, and drum dances to honour the contributors.




DENE STRONG: STORIES FROM THE LAND OF THE BIG POPLAR

Having heard about Dene Heroes of the Sahtu, Shane Janvier was inspired to create Dene Strong, a compilation of 30 stories centered around La Loche, Saskatchewan. 1,500 copies of Dene Strong were printed, honouring the Dene people and preserving their heritage.

Whole-hearted community support was shown, including the Lieutenant-Governor of Saskatchewan attending the book launch.
